Request a medical certificate stating cause of death You will need this when registering the death and arranging the funeral.		
Contact those closest to the deceased Family, friends, colleagues and neighbours		
Consider how you will fund the funeral Did the deceased have life insurance? Savings? Will the family be taking care of costs?		
Choose a funeral director if you wish The deceased may have chosen one previously. Bear in mind you don't have to use a funeral director. You can make all arrangements yourself if you like.		
Arrange for a funeral director to collect the body This makes things a lot easier but keep in mind that it is not mandatory.		
Register the death You will register the death in the nearest registrar of births and deaths to where the deceased passed away.		
Contact all relevant financial organisations of the deceased You must inform the relevant government and financial organisations of the person's death.		
Determine the disposition of the body i.e. burial vs cremation The deceased may have expressed whether they want to be buried or cremated		
Choose a coffin, casket or urn You will have to choose a coffin, casket or urn. If you're using a funeral director, they will provide this.		
Arrange the details of the ceremony Coffin, flowers, venue, caterers, music, transport, photographs, decorations, memorial cards.		
Appoint roles Pallbearers, someone to read eulogies, someone to lead the funeral like a celebrant or religious figure.		
Inform friends and relatives of the funeral arrangements Make sure to let everyone know about the details of the funeral i.e. time and place, dress code (if applicable), flowers vs donations.
